For the second year in a row, we were finalists in the Nonprofit-of-the-Year Competition held in the Czech Republic. Unlike last year, however, we were judged alongside the largest and most well-established organizations. And we finished in the top 3.

We also held our second annual Benefit Art Auction, which was a resounding success. We were able to meet many new partners and raise funds to promote and enhance our development and humanitarian work abroad.

- We work in areas in need of humanitarian aid.
- We provide aid and social support to women, children, and men living in refugee camps.

At our Prague headquarters, we welcomed new staff and team members who brought creative ideas and diverse perspectives, along with a strong sense of humor.

It was a fantastic year of growth and focus.

We want to thank everyone who used their own unique talents and gifts to improve our work and mission.

Together, we are working to build a safer world, a world where women and men have enough to eat and drink, where people can work, where children can attend school, and where all families have a safe home from which they will never have to run.

### Zpráva o účetní závěrce

Provedli jsme audit přiložené účetní závěrky společnosti Diakonie ČCE – Středisko humanitární a rozvojové spolupráce, která se skládá z rozvahy k 31. 12. 2015, výkazu zisku a stráty za rok končící 31. 12. 2015 a přílohy této účetní závěrky, která obsahuje popis použitých podstatných účetních metod a další vysvětlující informace. Údaje o společnosti Diakonie ČCE – Středisko humanitární a rozvojové spolupráce jsou uvedeny v příloze této účetní závěrky.

### Odpovědnost statutárního orgánu účetní jednotky za účetní závěrku

Statutární orgán společnosti Diakonie ČCE – Středisko humanitární a rozvojové spolupráce je odpovědný za sestavení účetní závěrky, která podává věrný a poctivý obraz v souladu s českými účetními předpisy, a za takový vnitřní kontrolní systém, který považuje za nezbytný pro sestavení účetní závěrky tak, aby neobsahovala významné nesprávnosti způsobené podvodem nebo chybou.

### Odpovědnost auditora

Naši odpovědnost je vyjádřit na základě našeho auditu výrok k této účetní závěrce. Audit jsme provedli v souladu se zákonem o auditorech, mezinárodními auditorskými standardy a souvisejícími aplikačními dohodkami Komory auditorů České republiky. V souladu s těmito předpisy jsme povinni dodržovat etické požadavky a naplánovat a provést audit tak, abychom získali přiměřenou jistotu, že účetní závěrka neobsahuje významné nesprávnosti.

Audit zahrnuje provedení auditorských postupů k získání důkazních informací o částkách a údajích zveřejněných v účetní závěrce. Výběr postupů závisí na úsudku auditora, zahrnujícím i vyhodnocení rizik významné nesprávnosti údajů uvedených



v účetní závěrce způsobená podvodem nebo chybou. Při vyhodnocování těchto rizik auditor posoudí vnitřní kontrolní systém relevantní pro sestavení účetní závěrky podávající věrný a poctivý obraz. Cílem tohoto posouzení je navrhnout vhodné auditorské postupy, nikoli vyjádřit se k účinnosti vnitřního kontrolního systému účetní jednotky. Audit též zahrnuje posouzení vhodnosti použitých účetních metod, přiměřenosti účetních odhadů provedených vedením i posouzení celkové prezentace účetní závěrky.




Collaboration with partners = more effective support for people.


- You are our partners. You are the foundation of who we are; our work could not go on without you. How exactly does your financial support help?


Where does your money go?




Why are some of the numbers in the graph so high?  
 The work of Diaconia is often a part of a larger whole: for example, for people affected by the earthquake in Nepal, we raised USD 53.5k. But due to the fact that we are in partnership with organizations from ACT Alliance, the total amount of money raised was actually USD 634k. Through partnership, we can help more people.

Humanitarian aid affects the greatest number of people and therefore requires the most money.
